THIRTY FIVE HAWAII BUSINESSSES SELECTED AS FINALISTS FOR APEC 2011 HAWAII BUSINESS INNOVATION SHOWCASE

HONOLULU — The APEC Hawaii Host Committee, in partnership with the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, Kauai County, the City and County of Honolulu, Maui County and Hawaii County, is pleased to announce the selection of 35 Hawaii businesses for the APEC 2011 Hawaii Business Innovation Showcase (see attached listing).

The finalists, six on Hawaii Island, three on Kauai, six on Maui and 20 on Oahu, will receive Recognition of Excellence awards from their respective county. In addition, a winner from each county and one overall statewide winner will be selected Sept. 6, and will receive recognition at various APEC 2011 Hawaii programs, as well as through other media opportunities.

Announced in May, the Showcase provides an unprecedented opportunity for businesses registered in the state to showcase innovation in products and services to an international audience during APEC 2011 Leaders' Week, and will recognize leading edge innovation and achievement in Hawaii's business community.

The criteria required of businesses and business-related projects included being attractive to markets outside Hawaii, including the APEC member Economies; having
